IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC COVID 19 VACCINATION IS **NOT OBLIGATORY** FOR ANY PROFESSIONAL OR AGE GROUP.

HOWEVER, ACCORDING TO THE CURRENT PROTECTIVE MEASURES, THOSE WHO ARE NOT VACCINATED (or alternatively have not recovered from Covid 19 in the last 180 days) WILL NEED TO TEST REGULARLY IN ORDER TO BE ABLE TO USE SOME SERVICES, SUCH AS RESTAURANTS, SWIMMING POOLS, HAIRDRESSERS, OR VISIT THEATERS, CINEMAS, CONCERTS, HOTELS, AND ALSO TO STAY AT THE STUDENT DORMITORIES

YOU DO NOT NEED VACCINATION OR TEST TO ENTER HOSPITALS, CLINICS, PUBLIC TRANSPORT, PUBLIC OFFICES.

INFORMATION ON CONDITIONS OF ENTRY IN THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS WILL BE UPDATED WHEN AVAILABLE.

E.U. Digital Covid Certicates:

In general, those who are holders of E.U. digital Covid Certificate and are fully vaccinated with one of the vaccines registered with the EMA (Pfizer, Astra Zeneca, Moderna, Johnson and Johnson) will have no problem entering the Czech. Full vaccination from the point of view of the Czech authorities means 14 days after the second shot of the two dose vaccine and 14 days after the first shot of the one dose vaccine. Same rules of entry apply to those who have recovered from Covid in the last 180 days. Only the common E.U. digital Covid Certificates are recognised in the Czech Republic for both vaccination and recovery.

Vaccination Certificates from countries outside the E.U.

Certificates from other than E.U. countries can be recognised in the Czech Republic (for EMA registered vaccines only), for more information, please have a look at <u>this site.</u>

Non-vaccinated students or students with certificates not recognised in the Czech Republic

Those who are not holders of E.U. Digital Covid Certificates will need to follow the conditions of entry in the Czech Republic from the country where they have stayed in the last 2 weeks. Currently, France is on the list of high risk countries, which means that unless you are fully vaccinated or have recovered from Covid in the last 180 days, you will be required to *take a PCR test before travel*, self –isolate for 5 days and take *another PCR test to end your isolation*. Please bear this in mind when planning your travel (also with regard to the planned meeting on Sept. 29th).

Rules of entry: Categories of countries and types of residency permit in the E.U.

Please note that the rules of entry are different for foreign nationals (non E.U. citizens) holding a permit (in the Czech Republic or another E.U. country) and those holding just a long term visa. Please see parts A and B <u>here</u>. If you only applied for a long term visa (in your passport) you fall in Category B. All E.U. citizens and foreign nationals hoding a long term residency in an E.U. country fall in Category A.
