St. Vitus, Wenceslas, and Adalbert Cathedral in Prague

Dear Mr. President, dear bereaved people, dear students, colleagues, dear Father Archbishop,

on behalf of the entire academic community, all staff, and students, and personally, I express sincere condolences to all those grieving the death of a loved one. When someone loses their life so senselessly, it takes a very long time before we can even accept this tragic news. Whether it is our loved one, a classmate, colleague, or friend.
